




April challenge – Ruins



- All archived images are allowed













Spring competition – Vertical Landscape









April Technique – Lens flare

- Lens flare is a response to a bright, non-image forming light like the sun, a full moon, or artificial lighting which appears on the photo in the form of a haze or a starburst. Lens flare can also happen when a bright light source becomes partially obscured by an object or person. Masterclass.com
- It can give a pleasing effect but if you wish to avoid lens flair, use a lens hood, clean your lens and avoid strong back lighting.







May Technique – Black & white + 1 (selective colour)

- Adding a single colour to a monochrome image allows you to highlight an important object, de-emphasize a cluttered background or simply draw the viewer to a particular hue.
- Even free software (e.g. Photoscape X) will allow you to create a B&W +1 photo by selecting a particular colour to keep or isolating an object and then desaturating the rest of the image.



WORKSHOP with Adrian Duey - Still Life and Food Lighting

- Date: 20 April 2024
- Time: Full day from 10 AM to 2 PM (bring lunch)
- Learn typical lighting set up used on location for food shoots
 - quality of light
 - basic lighting techniques for food
 - positive and negative fill
 - how to flag the key light source
- We will be using Speedlites and studio strobes, light modifiers and reflectors
- Equipment:
 - Camera, Tripod and lenses (50mm, 85mm or 24-70mm)
 - Bring old cutting boards, antique cutlery, linen tea towel, wooden spoon (nothing shiny)

WORKSHOP with Suliman Chadriji - Ambient Light

- Date: 18 May 2024
- **Time:** From 18:30 to 21:30 PM (taking advantage of the Golden hour @ 19:48, Sunset @ 20:38 and Blue Hour @ 20:52)
- Learn how to use natural light blended with ambient lighting from the buildings and street lights. Club members will act as models for each other to familiarize themselves with the use of natural light for portrait photography.
 - tips of composition in photography ie: Isolation, motion, perspective and repetition
 - lighting principles
 - slow shutter speed, in focus subject, moving vehicle in background
 - use of reflector and speedlight
- Equipment: Your camera with the widest f/stop lens available to you ie: f/2.8 or f/4
 - Tripod and Speedlight (optional)
